





Today Your Lawn Received It's EARLY SPRING APPLICATION - ROUND 1

WHAT IS IN THIS APPLICATION?

For Bermuda Grass: A pre-emergent application for crabgrass control and a post-emergent for broadleaf weed control. **For Shade Grass:** The first of two pre-emergent applications for crabgrass control and a pre-emergent for broadleaf weed control.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS APPLICATION?



Most importantly, to control crabgrass. While it cannot totally eliminate crabgrass, it will keep it from becoming a problem. Secondly, to control broadleaf weeds like dandelions, chickweed, henbit, dock, and clover. We use two different types of broadleaf weed control. One prevents certain weeds from coming up, and the other controls weeds present in the lawns at the time we spray.

HOW DO I KNOW IT'S WORKING?

The broadleaf weeds (like dandelions) will twist or curl, or simply not grow anymore. Browning occurs only at higher temperatures. Weed controls work more slowly in colder temperatures and could take up to two weeks. <u>The weeds remain in the lawn until you</u> <u>mow.</u>

DO I HAVE TO WATER THIS APPLICATION?

Ideally, all of our applications should be watered in. However, if you are unable to water, the application will still be effective. natures precipitation, frost, and dew will all do the job for you. If you can water, and if you have a broadleaf weed problem, (dandelions, henbit, etc.) try to wait 24 hours before watering. The application should be watered in (either by you or by rainfall) before mowing.

WHAT IF IT RAINS?

Rain right after an application simply waters it in for you, The only thing rain may affect is dandelion control. If you have no broadleaf weeds like dandelions or henbit in your lawn, it should be fine. If you have dandelions, give the application 10 days to see if the dandelions stop growing. If they don't, simply call us and we'll treat them again, FREE (Full program customers only).















It is advisable to let the application dry before letting your pet out or walking through the lawn. This could take 15 to 45 minutes depending on tempuratures and wind.

For Fescue, the material in this application has a yellow tint to it, which will not wash off. The yellow color is photo degradable, which means that sunlight breaks it down.

WHAT CAN I DO TO HELP MY LAWN THIS TIME OF YEAR?

If we haven't had significant rainfall, <u>water when you can.</u> Then, after all chance of frost has passed, (usually after the first of April) scalp your Bermuda lawn. Simply take a standard rotary lawn mower, set it on its lowest setting, mow the lawn, and pick up the clippings. This removes the dead grass that has provided insulation all winter and allows the sun to warm the ground, helping the grass green up earlier. Some Bermuda lawns MAY need to be dethatched. You can rent a machine to do this. If you're not sure if your lawn needs dethatched, feel free to have one of our managers look at it for you.

SHOULD I SEED MY LAWN IN THE SPRING?

WARNING: Any seed put down in the spring will hamper and delay us from applying your pre-emergent weed control, which would hamper seed germination.
